We have been fairly busy during the last month. The two main events were the ATV run and the Circus. The ATV run was a success. We made about the same or a little more as last year for the Travel Fund. We will get you the final figures as soon as they are available. The Circus we need to think about. The first three shows in Lewiston were pretty light. The last show Lewiston did bring in a good crowd, and both shows in Coeur d'Alene had very good crowds. I am hoping we brought in the budgeted amount. We should know the final number by July 8.

There is one piece of news that I don't really like to share, but we have to deal with it anyway. I would like to change this practice while I am Potentate. We have been operating on deficit spending for years. We have been using next year's dues to pay for this year's expenses. That should not happen. There is no way to sustain this practice as it

will always catch up to us in the end. We are looking at being around \$15K short again this year. We need to make that up by more fund raisers, an assessment on the clubs, raise dues, or an assessment on the Nobles. I don't like the idea of assessments or raising dues. I think we lose more in the long run than we gain in the short term. The true answer to the problem is membership. We are under 300 dues paying members. That is the magic number to start a new temple. You must have 300 members to get chartered as a temple. It is a hard thing to say, but it must be in the back of our minds. At what point do we fold the tents and end up consolidating with another temple? I do not want that to happen, and it won't happen on my watch. But we may have no choice in a couple more years.

Please think of ways we can get our

budget balanced and get more members.

The Embassy of the Republic of Korea seeks Korean War Veterans to honor with the Ambassador for Peace Medal.

Did you serve in Korea?



The Ambassador for Peace
Commemorative Medal is an
expression of appreciation from the
Korean government to American
service men and women who served
in the Korean War. The Ambassador
for Peace Medal was first presented
to veterans as a special memento
for those who returned to South
Korea through the 'Revisit Program'.
The honor has since expanded to
veterans who are unable to visit Korea.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the veteran must have served in Korea during the Korean War from June 25, 1950 to July 27, 1953 or participated in UN peacekeeping operations until the end of 1955.

Posthumous Awards

The commemorative medals may be awarded posthumously. The next of kin, such as a spouse or descendants may apply for the medal on behalf of a deceased veteran.
