Greetings Nobles,

In preparation for year's end and the upcoming annual meeting in January, please take notice of the following:

If you haven't paid your dues for 2022 yet, please do so. The Temple relies on your dues to pay the bills beginning the first of the year. Remember, if you cannot pay your dues all at once, we can take payments over a reasonable amount of time! And we can take your credit card payments over the phone.

Year-end reports from the Shrine Clubs and Units are due by the first week of January so that Calam can timely file our annual return to headquarters. Officers, please get them in to Michelle as soon as you can.

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

**Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print,

publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

**Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the

Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

I hope everyone is safe and health and I look forward to seeing you all at the Annual Meeting on January 8<sup>th</sup> 2022.




#### LADIES CORNER



#### Dave Garnett, P.P.:

July 11, 1949, to Dec. 2, 2021

Dave gave cancer a good fight for seven years, but in the end, COVID-19 got him at a hospital in Hawaii, shortly after sunset. He was 72. He was born in Coeur d'Alene and lived his entire life in Coeur d'Alene. With his passing the world is now a lesser place.

Dave had many talents, could fix most things. He was a big kid and played as hard as he worked. His passions were hanging wallpaper and traveling. Really loved visiting Hawaii, Disneyland, Las Vegas and many more places. We took many road trips as the children were growing up — memories, memories that will be cherished.
