We saw a professional hockey game, a Miranda Lambert concert, so many shows, and I got to volunteer at the Shriners Childrens Hospitals Open PGA Tournament. What a great event. Our patient ambassadors from the 22 hospitals showed up to represent our Hospitals and walked all 18 holes with their assigned golf pros. There was a ton of media coverage during the event and the replays featured a Shriners Patient or volunteer in just about every shot. It was a good time to visit with Shriners from around the country and catch up with our Imperial Divan.

We recently had our 150 year Fraternity and 100 year Hospital anniversary this last month. If you didn't catch the documentary that we did with Disney, it is still available on Hulu. It played on most of the major networks and CBS affiliates and brought an influx of donations to Shriners Hospitals. I think they increased by 200% in the few weeks after the special aired. The hospital is pushing on with the momentum of this campaign with "31 days to Amaze" during October. Over 500 local businesses in

the Spokane Hospital catchment area will be donating a portion of their proceeds during the month of October. Most of you will have purchased your Halloween supplies by the time you read this but Spirit of Halloween stores will be donating 20% of their profits in October to the Hospital. It is an exciting time to be in the fraternity and to support a philanthropy that is getting national attention.



Potentate's Message

Saturday the 22nd we held our third quarterly meeting which was well attended. We had great fun with the bottle auction and raised \$237 dollars raffling off everything from soap to Tobasco and wine. We heard some great stories from Bill Gross, the donor development director from Spokane Shriners Hospital. Bill and his team are doing a great job this year and our small hospital is in the top 5 of donations in the door for the year to date. We welcomed a new Noble Scott Castles and had two Nobles rejoin after a few years of absence. We will be officially welcoming Scott and a few other Nobles at the Joint Ceremonial next month. More on that later. We took care of a great deal of business at this meeting. We approved some administrative by-laws changes, approved \$20 dues increase, and approved the establishment of a permanent endowment fund for Calam Temple. The dues increase will take place starting in 2024 so there is time to get a life membership purchased before the price increases. We will be putting out more information on the endowment and how to contribute to it, but it will allow people to donate to a Temple fund that will kept in perpetuity either with direct cash donations or as a bequest from a will or estate. The interest earned will be used to supplement our Temple budget for years to come to keep us healthy and help eliminate any deficit Potentate 2022 spending. It is our hope that this will help us combat the membership losses we have sustained over the last few years.

The Joint Ceremonial with El Katif will take place in a few short weeks at the El Katif Event Center Friday November 11th and 12th. At current count we will have three Nobles going through the ceremonial and it would be amazing to see Calam Nobles come out to welcome them to our ranks and invite them to join our clubs and units. There are plenty of activities Saturday for Ladies and Nobles along with the Arch Ceremony which is guite the production. You should see an email with the RSVP instructions for Saturday Brunch and the Block Rate Hotel shortly. Lets show our support to the new Nobles and their Ladies and our thanks to El Katif for hosting again this year. Lastly, it is sad to report that the Black Camel came for Clayton Keifer PP recently. His service was last Saturday, and I heard it was lovely and well attended by friends, family, and Calam Nobility. Our thoughts and prayers are with the family. Annual Meeting Elections Notice

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution

of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Club and Unit Presidents: DO NOT FORGET that Club/ Unit Election Results were due to the Shrine Office by October 31 2022. Please report the names and current contract information for all club officers to the Shrine Office.
